Colonel Alfeo L. Bernardi, commander of the Southern California 12th Special Forces Group (Airborne) passed on December 25, 2011 at his home in Oregon. He was 92. Col. Bernardi was born on March 5th 1920 in Groppoli, Tuscany, Italy and emigrated to the U.S.A. via Ellis Island NY in the early 1920's. He served in WWII in both the Pacific and European Theaters of Combat. He then attended the University of Southern California earning his B.S. in 1948, and MEd. in 1949. The Colonel then served in Germany during the Korean War then returned home to pursue a career as a high school math teacher and reserve officer. Colonel Bernardi was on the cover of Time Magazine on June 3, 1966 and was also featured in the L.A. Times and Daily Breeze newspapers. Many of us knew him as our commander or teacher and will miss him. Please see our tribute to Colonel A. The 100 yard rifle range will be open all day and the long range to 600+ yards will be available in the afternoon. The pistol range is available all day. See the map on page 6 for directions.


SPECIAL FORCES ASSOCIATION 60th ANNUAL REUNION


SFA CHAPTER 78 SHOOTOUT

Directions to Chapter 78 Shootout Drive North on I-5 and exit at Templin Hwy

Exit at Templin Hwy – Turn right at bottom of exit ramp – Then make a quick left turn onto Paradise Ranch Road. Drive about two hundred yards on Paradise Ranch Rd At the entrance to the Paradise Ranch trailer park – veer to the right and follow the over head power lines back into the canyon. After about a mile you will pass the first gate (locked open). The second gate will have chain link fencing on both sides. This is the entrance to BRRC range.
