

IN MEMORIAM

CAPTAIN JAMES P. MONAGHAN AUGUST 9, 1936 - DECEMBER 7, 2012



JAMES P. MONAGHAN SOA # 27-GL - SFA # D-506, Captain, US Army, (Ret) passed away on December 7, 2012 at St Mary's Hospital in Long Beach, California from complications relating to exposure to Agent Orange.

Jim was born on the 9th of August 1936 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He entered the Army in 1953, and his first major assignment was to the 557th QM Co (Abn), an Aerial Delivery Unit in France. His Special Forces Assignments started with the 7th Special Forces Group at Fort Bragg. Then to 1st Special Forces Group Okinawa, Vietnam (A-421 Plei Mrong 1963, A-422 Ashau Valley 1964), and the Republic of China (Taiwan); 3rd Special Forces Group; 5th Special Forces Group (III Corps Mike Force A-302 1966; SOC-PAC Okinawa; 10th Special Forces Group Germany; 5th Special Forces Group (B-56/ Advisor to Team 162 Delta Project changeover to 81st Airborne Ranger Group 1970); 1st Special Forces Group Okinawa A-323 (SCUBA) and Army Readiness Region IX Presidio of San Francisco as Senior Enlisted Advisorto 3rd Bn, 12th Special Forces Group.

His many awards and decorations include the Silver Star, Soldier's Medal, Purple Heart w/2 OLC, ARCOM w/"V" Device, Presidential Unit Citation, Meritorious Unit Citation, Combat Infantryman's Badge, Vietnamese Service Medal w/6 Campaign Stars, Master Parachutist Badge, SCUBA Badge, Vietnam Cross of Gallantry w/Palm, Vietnam Cross of Gallantry w/Silver Star, and Vietnam Parachute Badge.

Jim was President of Chapter 2, Founding Member of Chapter 23, and a member of Chapter 43, Special Forces Association. He was also the second President of Special Operations Association. After his retirement in 1978 Jim was the Military Advisor in the production of the movies "Wild Geese 2", "Blue Skies", "Body Snatchers" and had a part in the movie "Chips and the War Dog".

Jim is survived by his former spouse Marie (they were planning to get remarried); two daughters, Helen Monaghan, Patricia Monaghan Wilson; two granddaughters, Amanda, Angie; one great granddaughter, Aubrey. There are tentative plans for a Memorial Service to be held at Fort Bragg. Burial will be held at Arlington National Cemetery at a date to be determined and announced by the Arlington Cemetery. James P was noted for always saying: "You might be out of sight, but you are never out of mind".

NIXON LIBRARY HONORS VETERANS

On December 9, 2012, the Nixon Presidential Library in Yorba Linda, California hosted their third annual salute to veterans. All veterans were invited, and special attention was paid to Blue Star and Gold Star families. Groups such as Special Forces Association Chapter 78 were acknowledged; each chapter member had his name called and a photo showing the soldier in his younger days was projected on the video screen. Members of three Gold Star families from the Vietnam era were acknowledged, as were the Gold and Blue Star families from the current War on Terror.

Retired Air Force Colonel Wayne Scott was the narrator. He did a superb job of describing awards and achievements for each of the honored soldiers and sailors, while a photo of each service member was shown on the video screen. A poignant moment was experienced by all in attendance when Col. Scott, his voice quivering with pride, described his father's contribution while serving as a fighter pilot during the Korean Conflict. The elder Scott stood with difficulty and acknowledged the cheers and applause of the crowd, which numbered more than 500 people.

As the name of each soldier was called, family members came forward and placed an ornament on a Christmas tree, the name of their soldier imprinted on the ornament. The tree was later rolled into the library foyer where it took its place among several other trees, all decorated with ornaments listing the names of those KIA during that war. Chapter member "Tilt" Meyer, who is also president of the Special Operations Association and I approached the tree decorated to honor local soldiers killed in Vietnam. We found the name of Henry T. Herrick on the first ornament we saw. Lt. Herrick was the leader of the "lost platoon" and was KIA on 14 November, 1965 in the la Drang Valley. He was from Laguna Beach, California.



The gathering proved a great success for Chapter 78, as we made many new friends and took the opportunity to spread the gospel about our charity, the Green Beret Foundation. For those unaware, the Green Beret Foundation was formed by retired Green Beret Aaron Anderson. He suffered grievous wounds in an IED explosion in 2006. After many surgeries, and being told by the V.A. that nothing more could be done for him, he decided to form the Foundation to help other Green Berets who found themselves in the same position. Now in its third year of operation, the Foundation has helped soldiers and their families with various forms of assistance not provided by the V.A.
